1. CALL TO ORDER/ ROLL CALL		The open session meeting of the El Camino Healthcare District Board of Directors (the "Board") was called to order at 5:30pm by Chair Kalbach. Chair Kalbach reviewed the logistics for the meeting. A verbal roll call was taken. Director Miller was absent. All other Board members were present and participated via teleconference and videoconference pursuant to Santa Clara County's shelter in place order. A quorum was present pursuant to State of California Executive Orders N-25-20 dated March 12, 2020 and N-29-20 dated March 18, 2020.

Staff read a communication from Ben Field, Executive Officer of the South Bay Labor Council, where Mr. Field expressed concerns about the appointment of an ad hoc committee.

	PROGRAM STATUS REPORT	Mr. Chughtai reviewed program results to date, noting that testing appointments began on June 7, 2020 and 1,104 community members had been tested as of July 15, 2020.	approved	
		Marketing efforts (in social media, print, and radio) have increased testing volume and staff will be tracking how community members hear		

about the program. He also described ECH's collaboration with the County on marketing and planning efforts. Mr. Chughtai commented that once scheduled, the testing experience is coordinated and efficient. Improving the scheduling process is an ongoing area of focus. He described plans to provide pop-up sites, address testing capacity and supplies, extend appointment hours, and explore additional laboratory options.

Ms. Muro described the improved online scheduling process, which is scheduled to go live during the week of July 20, 2020.

In response to Director Kalbach's question, Mr. Chughtai explained that staff is considering partnerships with multiple laboratories to meet supply needs, work is coordinated with the County, and program operations are continually evaluated to meet state and local guidance and requirements.

Directors Fung and Kalbach suggested clarifying that the testing uses a short swab; it is not a blood test and does not require the long, 12-inch swab.

In response Director Zoglin's questions, Mr. Chughtai explained that 1) permanent testing sites will be expanding hours outside of standard working hours, 2) there is work with local chambers to establish pop-up sites at farmers markets and downtown districts to provide more geographic access to testing, and 3) discussion with schools are ongoing. He reported that Dan Woods, CEO, has spoken with school superintendents in the District and explained that schools and school districts are currently developing plans, and testing programs will be tailored to meet those needs.

6. APPOINTMENT OF AD HOC COMMITTEE TO REVIEW COMPLIANCE ISSUE

Director Fung requested that this agenda item be postponed or tabled.

In response to Board questions, Mary Rotunno, General Counsel, clarified that the agenda item is based on the Compliance Issue Review policy, which states that a Board meeting shall be scheduled to consider whether to appoint an ad hoc committee to review a compliance issue, noting that the Board meeting is a mandatory requirement in the policy. She explained that there is no factual determination being made and the consideration of whether or not to form an ad hoc committee requires a Board vote.

Motion: To table this item until after the election.

Movant: Fung

There was no second to the motion.

Motion: To approve the formation of an Ad Hoc Committee pursuant to District's Compliance Issue Review Policy and Procedure dated March 25, 2014, in response to a complaint regarding unprofessional and disrespectful conduct of Director Miller at a recent District Board meeting.

Movant: Kalbach Second: Zoglin

Chair Kalbach commented that the vote is only on the formation of ad hoc committee, not passing any kind of judgment regarding the complaint. He discussed the Standards of Conduct signed by the District Board members in December 2018 and the adoption of the Compliance Issue Review Policy in March 2014.

Chair Kalbach commented that 1) neither the Chair nor the District Board

has the power to remove someone from office, and that is not the intent or charge for any ad hoc committee, and 2) this issue should be investigated to ensure transparency and accountability of the Board members and the Board as a whole.

Director Fung expressed concerns with the Board being asked to make a decision without the specific details of the complaint. He also commented that the timing is inappropriate due to the pandemic and the upcoming election and asked to delay this matter.

In response to Board questions, Chair Kalbach explained that names of the complainants are confidential. He confirmed that none of District Board members were the complainants.

Chair Kalbach asked for public comment on this matter. Terry Sandoval with SEIU-UHW asked whether the Chair can make a motion. There were no additional comments from the public.

Director Zoglin commented that trust of institutions and leadership is important, especially in a pandemic, people in positions of power should be held accountable, and the anonymity of the complainant should be protected. He voiced his support of the creation of the ad hoc committee.

Director Ting commented that he is a strong proponent of accountability and protection of employees and expressed concerns about delaying any investigation. He commented that he is in favor of moving forward with an ad hoc committee to conduct research to be able to evaluate the issue.

The Board further discussed the complaint and timing of the potential investigation.

Chair Kalbach restated the motion: approval of the formation of an Ad Hoc Committee pursuant to District's Compliance Issue Review Policy and Procedure dated March 25, 2014, in response to a complaint regarding unprofessional and disrespectful conduct of Director Miller at a recent District Board meeting.

Chair Kalbach stated that the charge of an ad hoc committee would be to investigate and review the complaint and come back to the Board with a recommendation to either dismiss the complaint or take Board action.

In response to Director Fung's question, Ms. Rotunno explained that there is no restriction on the Board Chair making a motion.

Dear Mr. Kalbach,

I am writing to express concern about the proposal, which is before the District Board on July 15, to appoint an ad hoc committee to review a "compliance issue." The issue, whether one of your colleagues on the District Board was sufficiently respectful and professional in her communications with staff, appears to be the result of a longstanding grudge, timed to cause political damage to your Board colleague.

The nature and timing of the complaint reflects badly on the hospital and its governance, suggesting that the District Board is willing to use its powers to serve a political agenda. The ad hoc committee seems designed to create an election issue. This strategy is not only an unethical intrusion into electoral politics, but it is likely to backfire on the hospital by spotlighting the disfunction of your Board.

I urge you not to move forward with the ad hoc committee. Even if there were a legitimate need for such an action, it would be appropriate only after the election season. Thank you for your attention to my request. Please feel free to contact me, if I can be of any service.

Subject: Status Report on the El Camino Healthcare District Community COVID-19 Testing

Program (the "District Program")

Purpose: To provide Board with updated information about the District Program.

Summary:

1. <u>Situation</u>: On May 19, 2020, the Board approved funding and operations of a no-cost Community COVID-19 testing program for asymptomatic individuals who live, work, or go to school in the District. Thereafter, on June 16, 2020, the Board modified the approval to authorize (1) prepaying of \$1.2 million in FY20 to El Camino Health to implement and manage the District Program in FY20 and FY21 and (2) distribution of \$1.2 million in FY21 to provide ongoing services to the District Program in FY21.

Authority: The District Board has authority to authorize the District CEO to distribute funding and manage public health initiatives in furtherance of its purpose which includes providing assistance in the operation of health care services for the benefit of the District and the people served by the District. Pursuant to this authorization, the District entered into a Services Agreement with El Camino Health to operate the District Program.

Background: Pursuant to the Agreement with El Camino Health, tests are currently being performed at the El Camino Health Mountain View hospital campus. To provide good stewardship of the District's tax revenues, El Camino Health is billing third party insurance and reserving District funds to cover the costs of testing when insurance is not available. As of July 31, 2020, 2,082 tests have been provided. The testing program is patient centered to facilitate quick-prescheduled appointments. Enhancements to the program included online scheduling, extended hours for appointments, and electronic results. Testing is currently being offered Monday through Friday from 7:30 am until 7:00 pm. The length of time to obtain results fluctuates with demand. As of August 3rd, we were receiving results in 3-5 days, but in prior weeks, it was taking as long as 7-10 days. We are carefully communicating with patients to set expectations accordingly. Our marketing and communications plan, which includes radio, social, and print media, dramatically increased the number of tests requested and we expanded hours of operations at the MV hospital campus to meet demand.

We are now focused on expanding the program to additional sites throughout the District in ways that will be of greatest benefit to the District. To that end, we are working with leaders of the Mountain View and Los Altos Chambers of Commerce and Sunnyvale Downtown Association to provide mobile testing sites within the District's business districts, particularly for employees of small businesses who are less likely to have insurance and whose work schedules make traveling to the El Camino Hospital campus impractical. Sites have been identified at the Center for the Performing Arts in downtown Mountain View, the Assistance League of Los Altos, and Murphy Park in Sunnyvale. We expect all of these sites to be up and running by no later than the last week in August.

Status Report on District Funded Community COVID-19 Testing Program August 12, 2020

We are also working with public school districts that have school sites within the District boundaries to plan for testing of school district personnel in advance of the beginning of the school year, even though it is anticipated that many schools will begin the year with distance learning. The timing of the intervals as well as the duration of the program has yet to be determined, but we hope to begin no later than the last week of August. We are monitoring third party insurance reimbursement for re-testing as that will impact how far the District funds can be stretched. As well, we recently reached out to the Community Services Agency of Sunnyvale and are in discussions about providing testing to their vulnerable clientele. Finally, we are working with Santa Clara County to identify "hot spots" of infection within the District where additional mobile sites may provide added benefit.

Basis of the El Camino Healthcare District FY 2021 Budget

- The District budget is first shown in "stand-alone" format, including those transactions which occur at the District level.
 - This presentation will cover the assumptions driving the District's budget and will provide information on District—level revenues and expenditures.
 - The budget for El Camino Hospital and its affiliates was reviewed at the hospital's joint finance committee meeting and special board meeting on July 27^{th.} Those meetings were both noticed on the hospital's website and were open to the public. Additional information on the budget for El Camino Hospital and its affiliates is available on the hospital's website (www.elcaminohospital.org).
- The District budget is also shown in consolidated format in this presentation as it is the District's responsibility to approve the consolidated budget.



Major Assumptions – El Camino Healthcare District

Excludes El Camino Hospital & its affiliates

- Other Operating Revenue is based on the existing ground lease agreement.
- This year the Redevelopment Agency revenues were once again budgeted as they continue to be distributed by the County without any lapse in payments in the past years.
- Operating Expenses are based on historical payment information with adjustments made for non-recurring expenses, which for budget FY2021 a placeholder of \$250,000 is projected for the November District Board election costs from the Santa Clara County Registrar of Voters.
- Community Benefit Support fee based on the cost of services as follows:

- Supplies and Other Expenses includes modest increases for Direct Mail material, website development, advertising and postage. The District's budgeted dues are expected to remain a constant of LAFCO at an amount of \$25,000 and \$7,000 for California Special Districts Association.
- Expenses related to the G.O. bonds are based on the 2017 G.O. Refunding outcomes and required payment schedules.
- Investment income is based on the expected return rate provided by our Investment Consultant of .09% for FY2021, based on the conservative investment position of the District, on an average cash balance of \$40M.
- Community Benefit expenditures are based on the Community Benefit plan.
- IGT Medi-Cal (PRIME) program It is expected that the District/Hospital will participate in the program again this year.

Recommendation(s): To approve Resolution 2020-07.

Summary:

- 1. <u>Situation</u>: Annually, the District Board must set the Tax Appropriation Limit (Gann Limit) for the following fiscal year.
- **2.** Authority: See above.
- 3. <u>Background</u>: Every May 1st, the Department of Finance of the State of California sends a letter to all Fiscal officers regarding "Price and Population Information." Since FY 08/09 we have been required to use the California Department of Finance Demographics website link, which provides the variables for cost-of-living factors and population changes from the prior year from which we select to calculate the Prop 13 Tax Appropriation Limit. Our selections are made to maximize the funds available for Community Benefit Programs and the operational expenses of the District.

A. Cost of Living Category:

- The change in California per capita personal income from the preceding year was a positive 3.73%
- The percentage change in local assessment due to nonresidential new construction from the previous year. This change is no longer provided.

We selected the % change in per capita personal income of a positive 3.73% (1.0373)

B. Change in Population:

- The population change within the District was a positive 0.0051%
- The population change within the County was a positive 0.0037%

We selected the District: 0.0051

C. Calculation:

- Change in Per Capita Income of 1.0373 x Change in District Population of 0.0051 = 1.0426 (multiplier); Last Year's Limit of \$8,844,668 x multiplier of 1.0426 = FY21 Appropriation Limit of \$9,221,451.00.

ECHD RESOLUTION 2020-07

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF EL CAMINO HEALTHCARE DISTRICT ESTABLISHING THE APPPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020 -21 IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE XIIIB OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, El Camino Healthcare District ("District") has completed its budget analysis and preparation for fiscal year 2021 (July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021) and, pursuant to Article XIIIB of the California Constitution and SS7900 et seq of the California Government Code, has computed its appropriations limit for such fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, S7910 requires the District to establish by resolution its appropriations limit for the upcoming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, Article XIIIB S8 (e)(2) directs the District to select its change in the cost of living annually by using either of the following two measurements and to record the vote of the District Board in making this choice:

- a) the percentage change in California per capita personal income from the preceding year, or
- b) the percentage change in the local assessment roll from the preceding year for the District due to the addition of local nonresidential new construction; and

WHEREAS, Article XIII S8 (f) and S790 (b) directs the District to select its change in the population annually by using either of the following two measurement(s) and to record the vote of the District Board in making this choice:

- a) change in population within the District, or
- b) change in population within Santa Clara County

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

1. For fiscal year 2021, the District hereby elects to use the following measurement to calculate the District's change in the cost of living:

The percentage change in the California per capita personal income from the preceding year (3.73%).

2. For fiscal year 2021, the District hereby elects to use the following measurement to calculate the change in population:

The change in population within the District of 0.0051%.

- 3. The Secretary of the District is hereby directed to include in the minutes a record of the vote of each member of the District Board as to the choices set forth in paragraphs 1 and 2.
- 4. For fiscal year 2021, the District's total annual appropriations subject to limitation are \$9,221,451.00 calculated as follows.
 - a. 1.0373 x 0.0051 = 1.0426 (multiplier) b. 1.0426 x \$8,844,668.27 (FY 2020 limit) = \$9,221,451.00
- 5. As required by Article XIIIB S1, the District's total annual appropriations subject to limitation for fiscal year 2019-20 should not exceed the District's appropriations limit for fiscal year 2021.
